DYSLEXIA AWARENESS MONTH:

As James mentioned in the last newsletter, October is Dyslexia awareness month and this year it has been extended until November 15th. The Code Read Organisation encourages school and local communities to help shine a light on Dyslexia and open up the conversation in order to raise awareness and knowledge of Dyslexia.

Dyslexia is a specific learning disability that is neurobiological in origin. It is characterized by difficulties with accurate and/or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities. These difficulties typically result from a deficit in the phonological component of language that is often unexpected in relation to other cognitive abilities and the provision of effective classroom instruction.

Next **Thursday**, **10**th **November**, we invite students to wear a 'splash' of red, as we too aim to raise awareness of dyslexia within our school community. Students might wear red socks, wristbands, ribbons, t-shirts etc. Let's stand with our students with dyslexia and their families- as we work together to raise awareness and to ensure that we continue to provide excellent support based on student needs.
